Articles from Journals, Magazines, or Newspapers (7.01)

Print	
Author(s).	Lastname, Firstinitial., Lastname, Firstinitial, & Lastname, Firstinitial.
(Year, Month Day).	Include month and day if available.
Title of article.	Capitalize proper nouns and the first word of the title and any subtitle (sentence case).
Title of Journal or Magazine,	All main words are capitalized (title case) in italics,
Volume number	If available.
(issue number),	If available (no space after volume number).
Pages.	If available. For newspapers, include p. and pp., e.g., p. B2 and pp. C1, C3-C4.
Online	
Retrieved from DOI or URL	In order of preference: DOI, permalink, or full URL

Location	
Publisher.	Include if retrieved online unless publisher is also the author. E.g., Washington, DC: Government Printing Office.
Retrieved from URL	Full URL

Author(s) or Editor(s) if no author.	Lastname, Firstinitial., & Lastname, Firstinitial. (Eds.).
(Year, Month Date).	If no date, write (n.d.).
Title of web page or post	Capitalize proper nouns and the first word of the title and any subtitle (sentence case), in italics
[Format description].	E.g., [Blog post] or [Video file].
Retrieved from URL	Full URL

Note: When referencing an entire website, it is enough to include the website title and URL in the text of your paper. You do not need to also include the citation in the reference list.
